

June 8, 2025, is Pentecost Sunday. In honor of Pentecost, I ask everyone to wear something red that Sunday morning. We will adorn the sanctuary with candles representing the tongues of fire that rested on the disciples that first Pentecost. In Acts Chapter 2, we read of a mighty rushing wind and cloven tongues of fire.

¹ When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

~ Acts 2:1-4

In honor of Pentecost season, beginning June 4, 2025, I will present a study of the Holy Spirit on Wednesday evenings. This new study will take us through the end of August. The study begins with the first mention of the Holy Spirit in scripture in the Book of Genesis where the Spirit moved over the face of the waters. God breathed the Spirit of life into Adam. And human life began, all by the power of the Spirit.

The work of the Holy Spirit continued in the Old Testament through the Spirit of the Lord speaking through the prophets of old. Samson was given strength by the Spirit of God. David was led by the Spirit. And so on. Then we will move on to the New Testament. It is rich with Holy Spirit activity. The Holy Spirit is God as named in the Trinity of God: Father-Son-Spirit. On Wednesday evenings we will discuss the symbols of the Holy Spirit. Flame, water, and even the dove that descended at the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist.

We will work our way through the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, and anointing of the Holy Spirit. You won't want to miss a single lesson. The Holy Spirit will remind us of all that Jesus says in the bible. Words to live by and words to study so that we may learn more about God, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit empowers us to do what Jesus said to do. Yes, the Holy Spirit is called the Advocate in the book of John:

But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.

One last encouragement before we finish. Pray... Pray in the Spirit. Pray to God, the Holy Spirit. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, intercede for others. Ask for boldness to share Christ. Be led by the Spirit.

Make a decision this month to study the Holy Spirit in scripture with me. Many, many scriptures tell us that the Holy Spirit is with us. Commit to viewing each meditation weekly. You may even want to invite someone to join you. I am eager to study, teach, and share about God, the Holy Spirit, this Pentecost Season. Thank you in advance for joining me each Wednesday evening this Summer.




Our Healthier Eating group at DVUMC is studying the book "End Emotional
